



Our Mission

The Philadelphia CeaseFire program, based at the Katz School of Medicine at Temple University has established a 24hr Crisis Intervention program funded by VOCA that provides victim services support to individuals and families that have been impacted by crime throughout the City of Philadelphia.

VOCA stands for "Victims of Crime Act."

The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) was passed by Congress and signed into law by on October 12, 1984, establishing the Crime Victims' Fund. Millions of dollars are deposited annually into the fund from criminal fines, penalties, forfeited bail bonds, and special assessments collected by the federal government. The Crime Victims' Fund releases a set amount each year based on a cap set by the federal appropriations bill. States such as PA apply each year for these funds via the VOCA Formula Grant Program.
